Kristy's mother is doing wonderful with her treatment. Thelma Newsome is doing well after surgery. Kristy gave an update on homebound members.

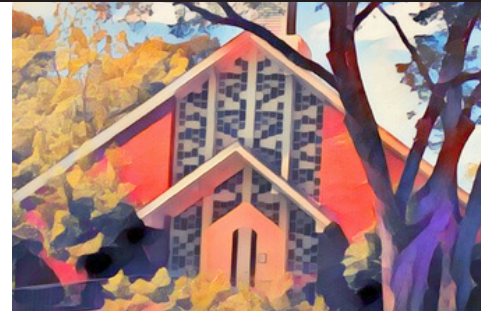
Old Business:

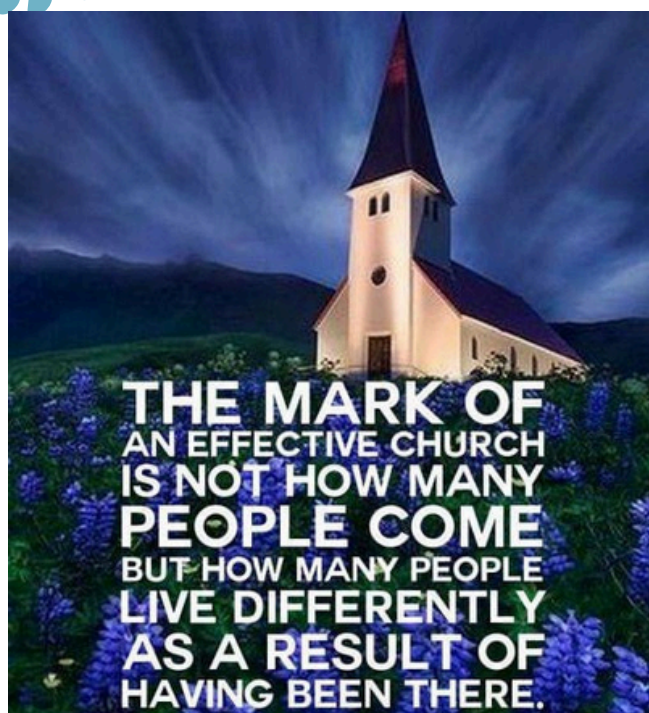
